The Fine Arts Festival was a very exciting event for the Grade elevens of 1970-71. We presented three plays — a comedy, **The Marriage Proposal**, a tragedy, **The Valiant**, and a medieval morality play, **Everyman**.

**The Marriage Proposal**, a Russian comedy, poked fun at the proposal of marriage of a young man to his girlfriend. The father's continual interference added a light atmosphere to the situation.

In direct contrast to this, **The Valiant** presented the tragic story of a young man who lost his life in the gas chamber. He denied having a family in an attempt to cause his sister, who came to visit him, no grief.

The medieval morality play, **Everyman**, is symbolic of life. Everyman calls upon Friendship, Goods and Beauty to go along with him on the journey to death, but they refuse him. Finally Good Deeds offers to accompany him on this trek to death.

Dr. Falke's successful plot leads him to be named "Cruel Bat".

The story ends happily when all are forgiven for their wrong-doings and the entire cast of characters joins to sing "Ah, What a Feast, What a Night of Bliss!"

## “Martyr’s Mirror”

On March sixteenth and seventeenth, our student body presented an oratorio entitled, “The Martyr’s Mirror”. It is a work by Alice Parker and John Ruth; a dramatic musical composition seeking to extend the image of “martyr”.

The audience’s attention was first aroused by the opening processional, sung in Latin. The confessions of faith and the executions of the four martyrs—George Blaurock, his wife, Catharina, Jan Wouters and his wife, Mayeken—stirred many hearts. I am sure that all who were involved were touched by this moving drama. It, in fact, portrays the origin of our own religious sect, the Mennonites.

We hope the impressions left by this presentation will remain imprinted in the minds of the audience and students alike.

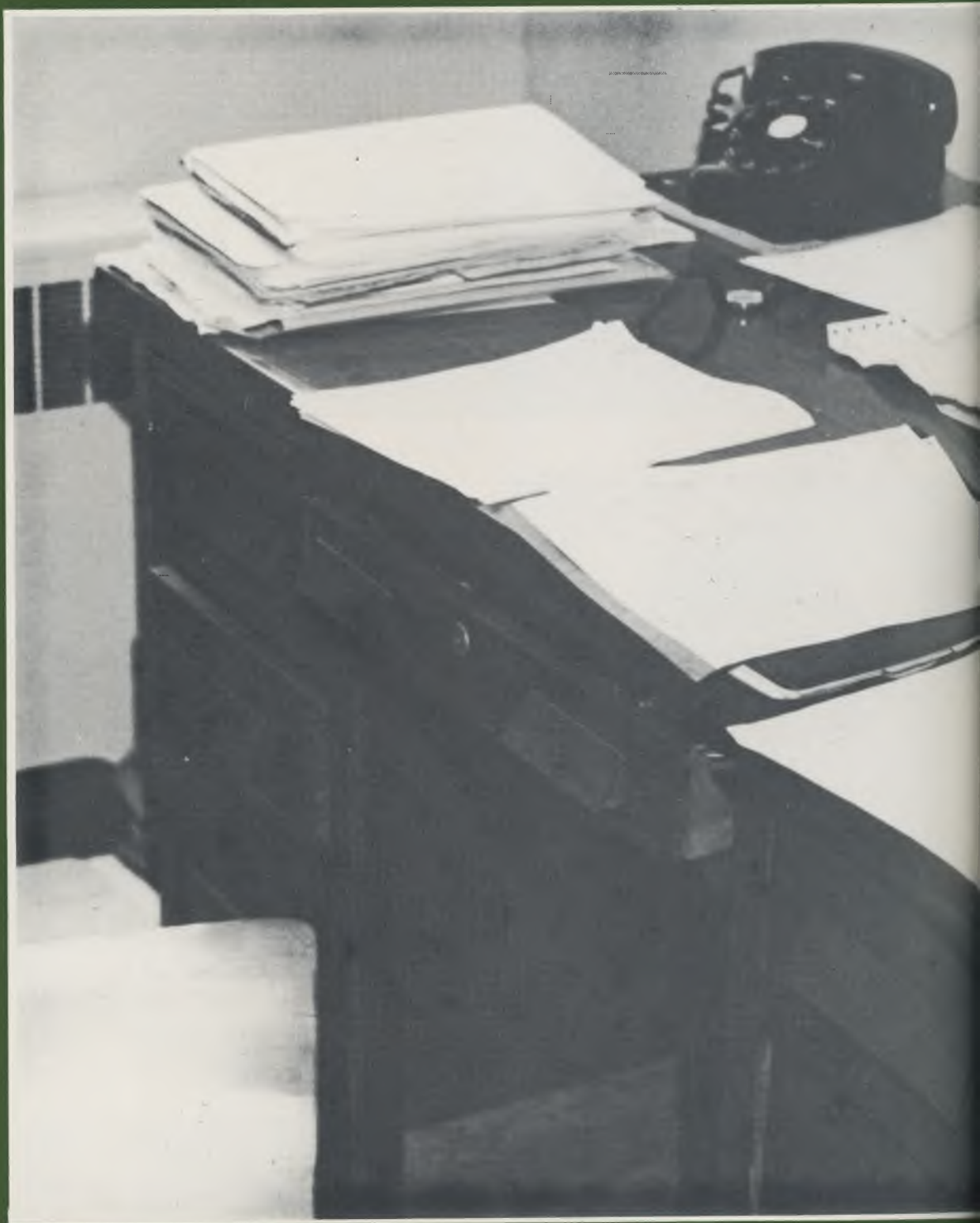

## COURSES OF STUDIES

The first four years of the General Course (the first four years of the five-year program of the Arts and Science Branch) are taught. About one-quarter of the time is devoted to the study of Religion, Church History and German.

The following subjects will be taught (as prescribed by the Department of Education).

GRADE 9 — Bible (Old Testament) and Church History, German, English, History, Geography, Mathematics, Typing, Science, Physical and Health Education, Guidance, and Choir.

GRADE 10 — Bible (New Testament) and Church History, German, English, History, Geography, Mathematics, Typing, Science, Physical and Health Education, Choir.

GRADE 11 — Bible (New Testament, Acts, Epistles) and Mennonite History, German, English, World History I, Physical and Health Education, Geography I, Mathematics I, Physics, Vocal Music.

GRADE 12 — Catechism and Mennonite History, German, English, World History II, Physical and Health Education, Geography II, Mathematics II, Chemistry, Business Law, Vocal Music.

## Spiritual Emphasis

# ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS and REGULATIONS

Students will be accepted by the school without regard to their church affiliations. A limited number of non-Mennonite students will be accepted. For information, write to: U.M.E.I., R. R. 5, Leamington, Ontario.

Academic entrance requirements in our school are the same as those of other High Schools of the province (Grade 8 Certificate).

Registration Day will be held four weeks before classes begin. At the same time new books may be ordered from the school. Forms may be obtained by writing to U.M.E.I., R. R. 5, Leamington.

Local students will register and order new books in person on Registration Day. Distant students should register and order new books by mail before Registration Day. Late registrations will be accepted but any new books ordered will come late.

All students of the U.M.E.I. are required to conduct themselves in accord with the highest ideal of Christian character and to abstain from all practices that would not be tolerated in a truly Christian family.

Girls are required to wear a prescribed uniform. The material will be bought by the school where it can be had for cost price. A description of the pattern will accompany every order of material. Apply to the house mother.

5. J. Rempel Memorial Prize for Religion — \$10 to the student of each grade with the highest standing in Religion — \$5 to the student of each grade with the second highest standing in religion.
6. German Society Prize — \$10 to the student of each grade with the highest standing in German.
7. The 75% Pin — Awarded to each student who has an average of 75% or better for three years.

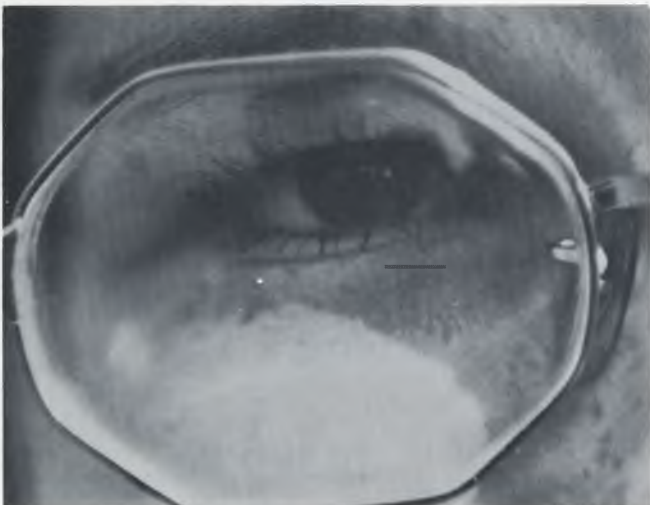

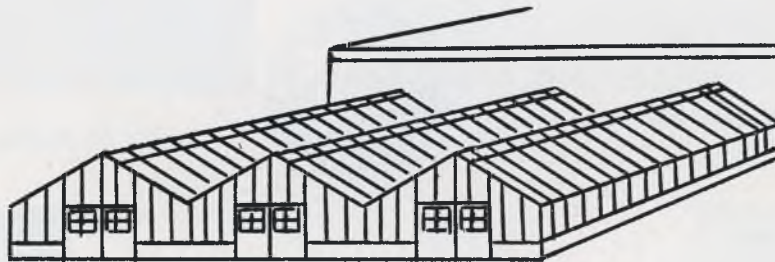
