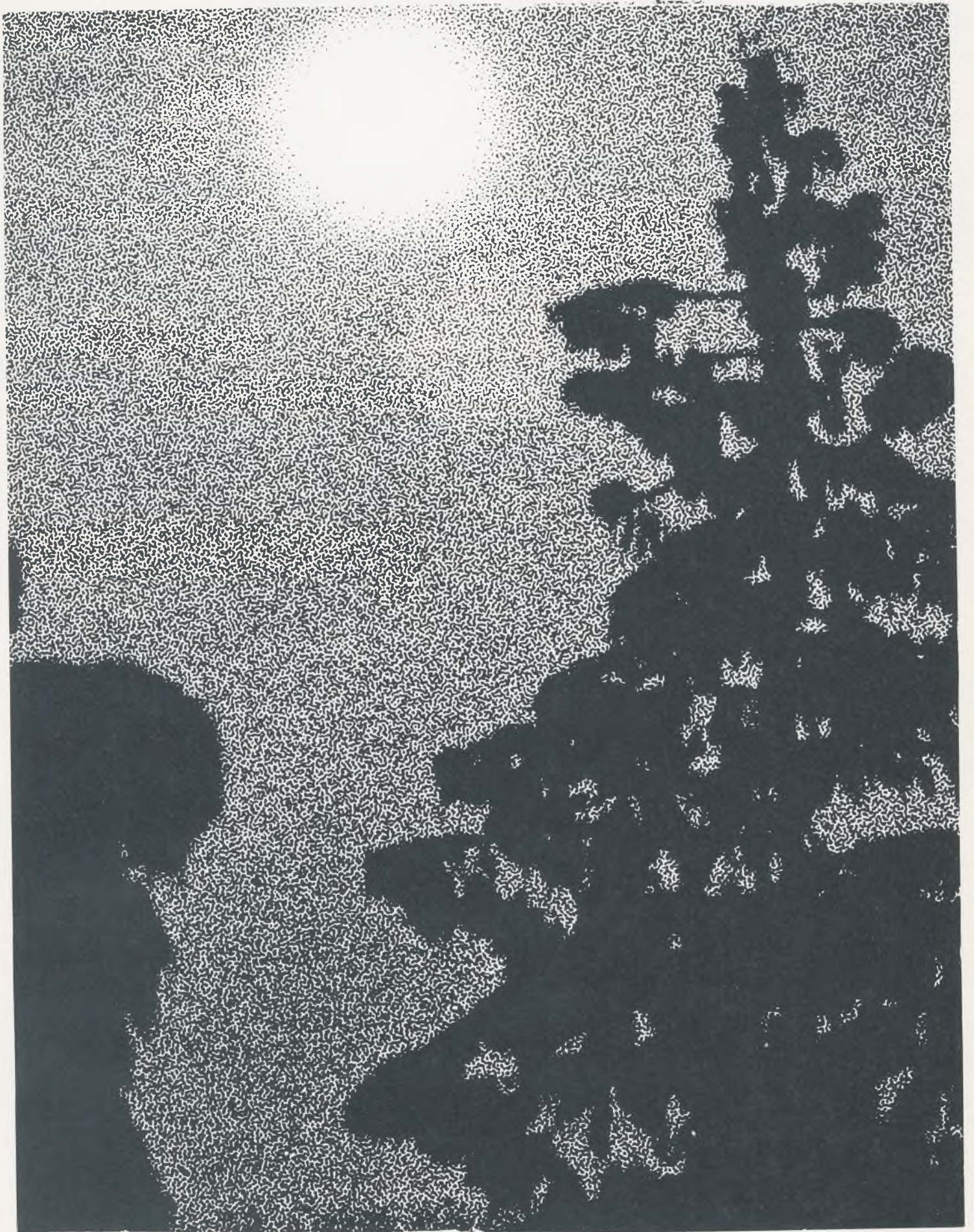

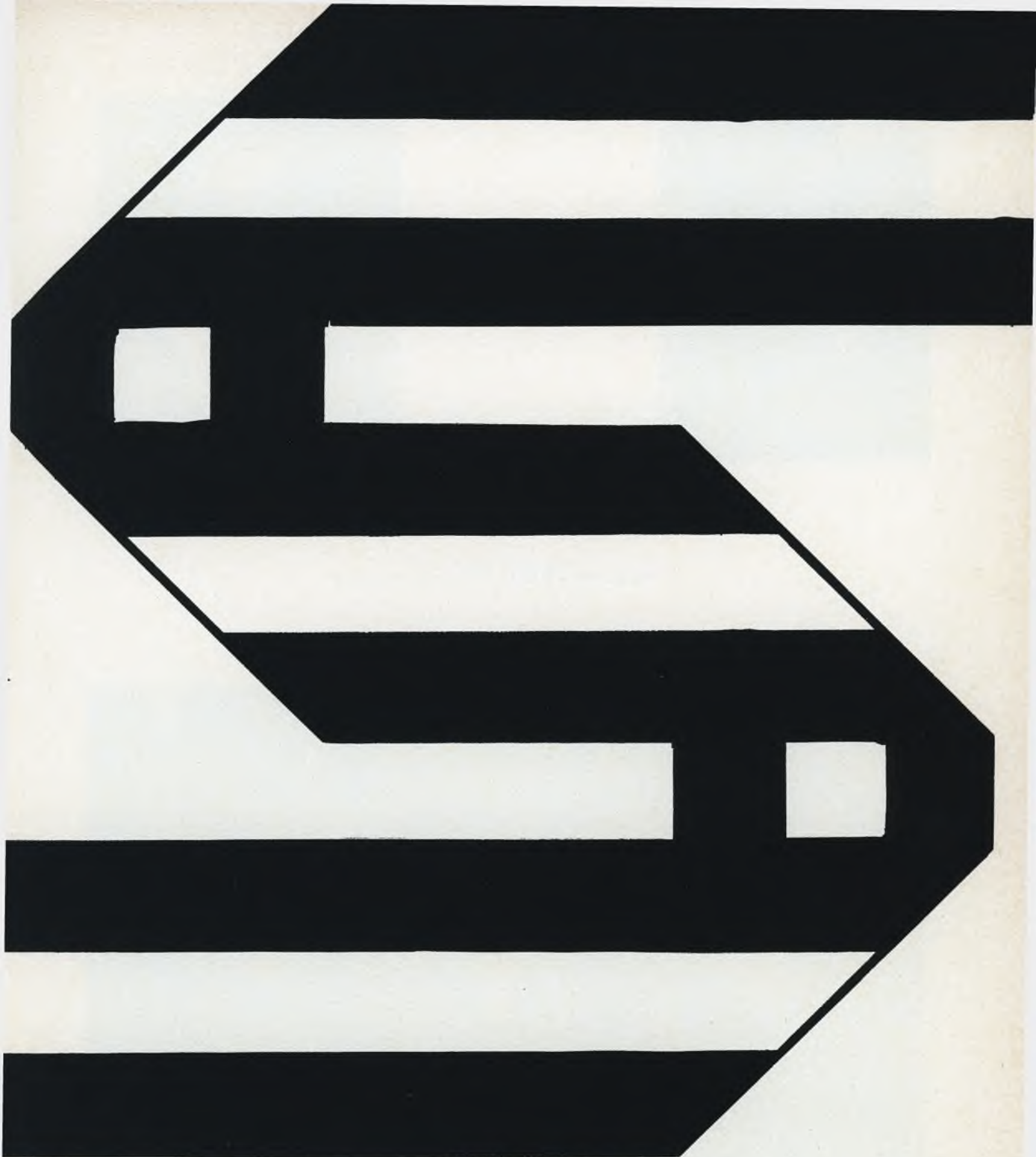

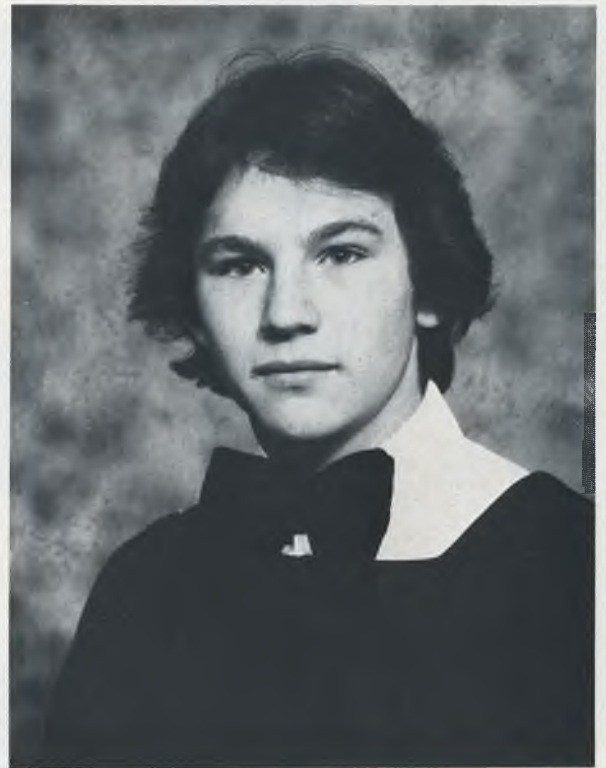


GRADS

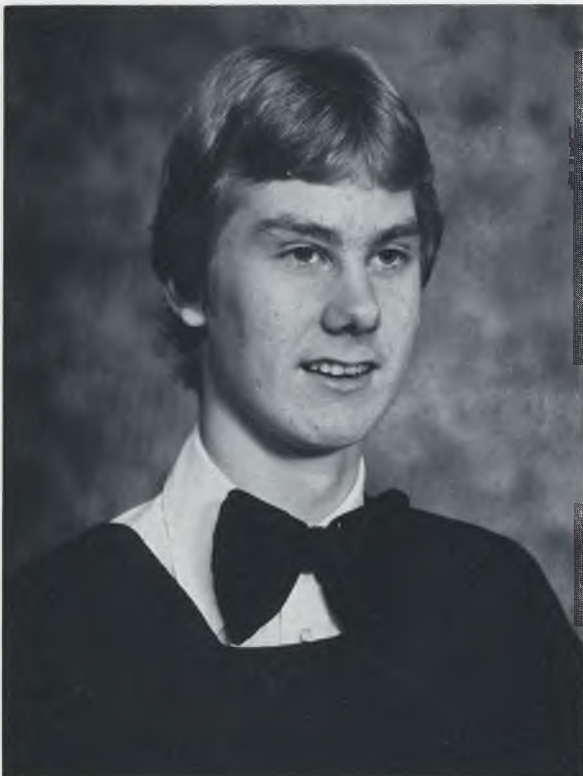
CAROL FROESE

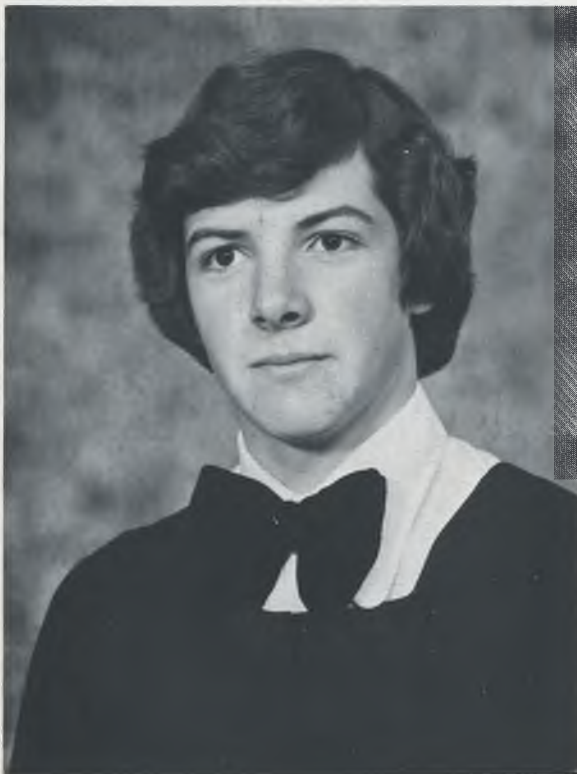


BARB KLASSEN

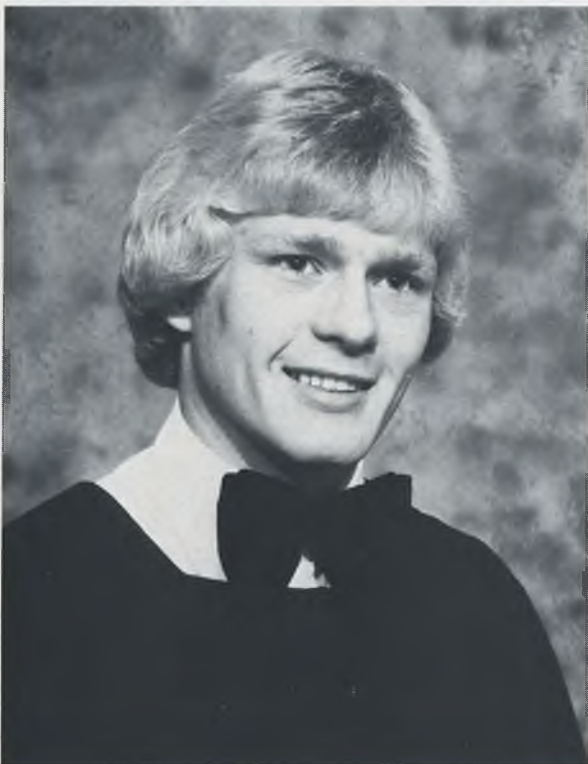
PETER NEUFELD

RICK NEUFELD

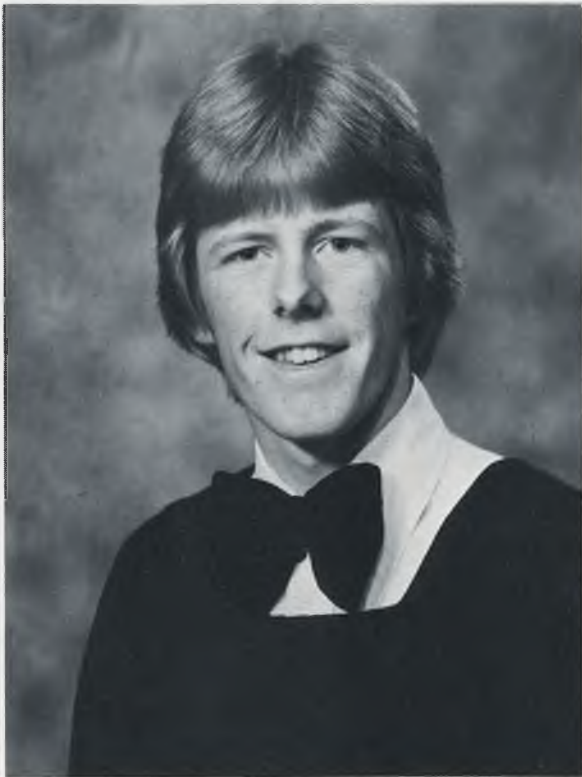

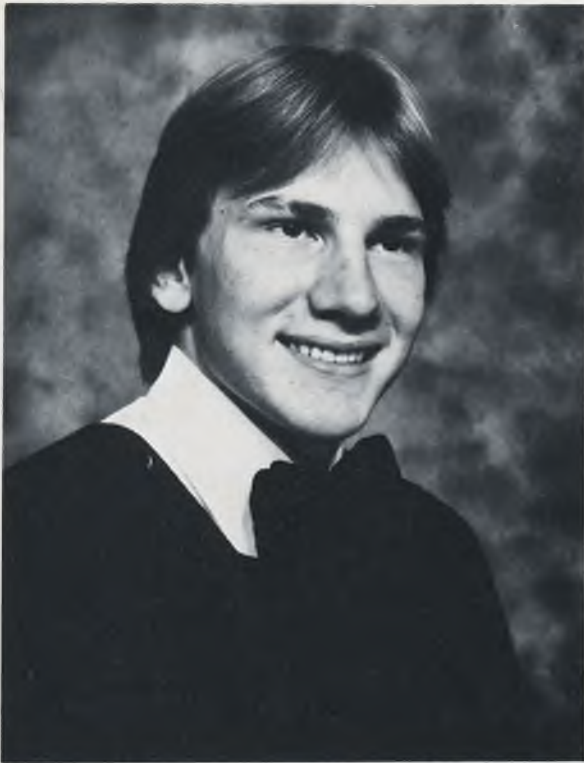
RON TIESSEN

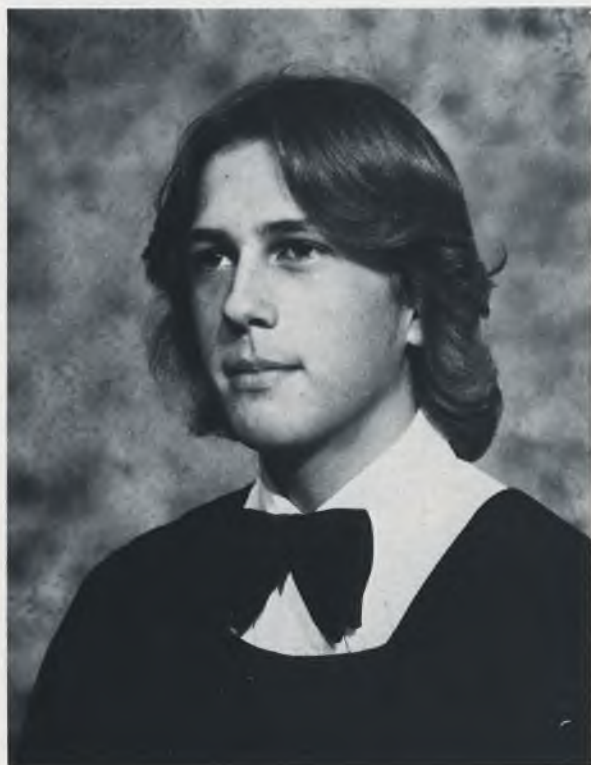


JULIE WILLMS

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS AND REGISTRATION

Academic entrance requirements are the same as those of other high schools in the province; namely, a Grade 8 Certificate.

Students will be accepted by the school without regard to their church affiliations. Prospective students should familiarize themselves with the aims of the school. For information, write to the school at the following address: U.M.E.I., R.R. #5, Leamington, Ontario N8H 3V8.

Registration forms are distributed or mailed, beginning in January. Completed forms should be returned as soon as possible. Text books should be ordered as specified upon registration.

SPIRITUAL EMPHASIS

The United Mennonite Educational Institute came to exist in answer to a definitely-felt need of the United Mennonite congregations in Ontario. Our institute aims at the promotion of intellectual growth and the acquisition of knowledge, and also at the development of a truly Christian character of the student — the cultivation of his spiritual and moral faculties. Its aim, therefore, is to help the student to attain in full measure a true faith in God. This is strived at not only through the studies of the Bible, Church History, and Mennonite History, but also through a spiritual emphasis which is stressed in everyday activities.

COURSES OF STUDY AND REGULATIONS

The first four years — Grades 9 to 12 — of the five-year high school program prescribed by the Ministry of Education are offered. Most of the courses are at the Advanced Level of difficulty; some are at the General Level. Students who successfully complete Grade 12 are granted the Secondary School Graduation Diploma.

In addition, all students are required to take the courses offered in Bible, Church History, and Mennonite History. Students who successfully complete these courses are granted a U.M.E.I. Diploma for Religious Studies at Graduation.

The detailed **calendar** of the school describes the courses that are required and offered; the **student handbook** describes and explains such things as expected behaviour, extracurricular activities, dress code, and calendar of events for the year. Both of these booklets are available at the school upon request.

All payments are due half-yearly and in advance.
